Friday – OneMind Dogs Sequencing

The group will work on shorter sequences (8-10 obstacles) consisting only of jumps and tunnels and be familiar with the OneMind Dogs techniques. With shorter sequences, handlers will be able to focus on perfecting their execution of the OneMind Dogs Techniques, including concentrating on timing and delivery of cues. Contacts and weaves will not be included.

Format & Requirements:

There will be 2 groups of 10 teams. Students will spend ¹/₂ day working with each instructor.

Dogs should have a solid start line and should be sequencing 8-10 obstacles consisting of jumps and tunnels (full height jumps not required). Dogs and puppies 10 months and older are welcome. Dogs should be able to work in a distracting environment.

It is recommended that the handler has attended a OneMind Dogs techniques seminar in the past 24 months with a OneMind Dogs coach.

Note: Camp will be divided into two rings in the green building. Therefore, if your dog is highly distracted by dogs and motion in an adjacent ring, this camp may not be the best choice for your dog.

Saturday and Sunday – Coursework

Dogs should be competing in the USDAA Advanced/Masters level or AKC Excellent level or equivalent. Dogs should be proficient on all equipment and should be performing full coursework.

It is recommended that the handler has attended a OneMind Dogs techniques seminar in the past 24 months with a OneMind Dogs coach.
